## AGC GLASS EUROPE

### Conflict Minerals Declaration 2026

AGC Glass Europe ("AGC") complies with Conflict Minerals legislation and has established a due diligence procedure to prevent any breaches.

Conflict Minerals are defined as Gold (Au), Tantalum (Ta), Tungsten (W), and Tin (Sn) originating from conflict-affected and high-risk areas, where they may be controlled by non-governmental military groups.

AGC requires its supply chain partners to confirm that materials purchased by AGC do not contain Conflict Minerals. We also require them to provide declarations confirming that their own supply chains have been examined for this purpose and to maintain their own due diligence procedures to address any sourcing violations.

According to our suppliers' declarations (CMRT), they either do not source from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries, use smelters listed as conformant by the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI), or source from recycled or scrap materials.

Based on these supplier declarations, AGC confirms that the minerals used in its processes comply with Conflict Minerals legislation. We further confirm that AGC's current approach to verifying its supply chain is in line with the EU Regulation on Conflict Minerals and the applicable national legislations.
